This term Beech class are learning about different festivals and celebrations and the reasons behind certain events.

First, they discovered the history behind Bonfire Night. The children explored various sources from the past to prove given facts. They also enjoyed making and holding their own indoor firework party, with a bonfire and sparklers.

Last week, the class thought about Remembrance Day and discovered why people wear poppies on and before the 11th of November. The children worked together to make a poppy wreath which they placed on the memorial during the whole school service last Friday.

This week, the children are finding out about the Hindu festival of Light, Diwali. The class have enjoyed finding out about the different activities that those who follow this religion do for Diwali and compared them with things they do themselves when celebrating other events, such as fireworks, decorating homes, giving presents, wearing new clothes, and eating special food. The children enjoyed making Rangoli patterns and making colourful lanterns.







Forest School

This term during forest school, the children are focusing on shapes and patterns in our school grounds.

So far, the children have noticed lines of symmetry in many natural objects, such as leaves. They have used resources to make symmetrical patterns and different shape frames to contain their artwork.







Chestnut Class

Chestnut class has come back from half-term with a brilliant attitude to learning. They approach every subject with an amazing attitude and willingness to learn. As a class, we have focused on Geography. The children can name all the countries in the United Kingdom. We have also used maps to explore our local areas, including Winchester. The children have explored their local school grounds and created wonderful maps to represent them. Chestnut class will continue to learn about their local town, the landmarks, and notable features.

In Maths, we have built on our addition and subtraction to include multiplication and division. Children have been grouping and sharing objects to experience this. We have also been learning with shape and fractions this half-term. Everyone has loved learning about the specific properties of shapes. The Year 1s have been learning their 2D and 3D shapes and how to split them in half. The Year 2s have been solidifying their knowledge of halves and quarters.

In English, we have been reading the book 'Big Brother, Little Brother'. We have been writing words in contracted forms and using them in our everyday language. We have also been learning how to write in the first person and have had a lovely time role-playing as different characters from the story. The children have tackled their first 'big write' with confidence and show an amazing willingness to learn from their mistakes.

Chestnut class continue to develop in their resilience when faced with challenges and their effortless ability to be happy.













In Willow Class we have now nailed our routines and are working well as a unit. We have organised our First trip to Hillier Gardens for a Romans Activity Day which aligns with our History Topic of Roman Invaders.

In Maths this term, the main focusses will be Geometry and Measurements. This includes lessons on 2D shapes, symmetry, angles and using different units of measurement.

In English, we are using our writing skills to set a forest scene. This is inspired from the book 'The Tin Forest'. The children will be using parts of speech such as adjectives, verbs, and adverbs to set their scene which will be packed with animal and forest imagery.

Can I please remind children to bring their PE kits on PE days (Tuesday and Wednesday). We also need to make sure they have the appropriate kit for PE and clubs (e.g. tracksuit bottoms) as it is getting colder and muddier outside.

Spellings will continue as homework, given and due every Friday. I will also be giving all the children a homework information sheet which will simply document when your child completes any homework, maths challenge or reading. By doing so, they can earn themselves house points.

For your information, each morning the same routine will continue where it will be either quiet reading or carrying on with their maths challenge books. Please see the schedule below.

There have been some fantastic learning opportunities for Oak class over the first few weeks of term, with everyone showing lots of enthusiasm towards our new topics.

In our English lessons, we have been using the text 'Street Child' by Berlie Doherty as a stimulus for writing. We began by using the text to develop our understanding of workhouses and writing diary entries as if we lived in the workhouse, describing the terrible conditions. We then focussed on chapter 8, where our main character escaped from the workhouse. As a class, we held a press conference to gather information from the witnesses, before using our knowledge of the plot to write a newspaper report. This week, we have been looking at discussion texts and exploring how we can use semi-colons, relative clauses and modal verbs to develop a detailed discussion about workhouses for the Victorian public.

The children have been very excited to use a new piece of equipment in Computing, known as Mirco:bit. We had our first lesson familiarising ourselves with the technology and programme, which we called' tinkering', and working out how to get the Micro:Bit to make sounds or light up when commanded. In our next lesson, we used our knowledge of the programme to program our own animation. We are having so much fun with Micro:Bit that some children are staying in at break and lunch to continue practising!

Our Science lessons have been focussed on developing our scientific skills, through our understanding of dissolving. We explored the difference between independent, dependent and control variables and used this knowledge to develop our own investigation question in groups. We can't wait to continue to process and conduct our experiment.

In music lessons, we have been learning about staff notation to help us read music and play this on the xylophones. We looked at parts of music and began to recognise the time signature and where the bars ended. We then tried playing a piece of music with minims in them, trying to count out two beats per note played.
