Reports – Friday 7th July

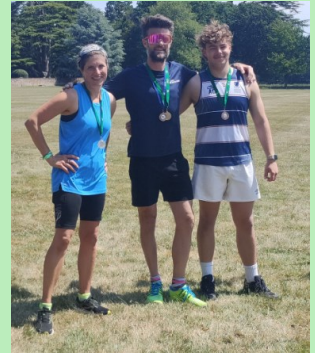

Beech Class

We have finished our learning journey of 'Leo and the Octopus' and the Year 1 girls have completed fact files based on octopuses. Copies of these will be sent to the Oceanarium in Bournemouth to show them how much we have learnt about these mysterious creatures.

A group of cheeky pirates have infiltrated our classroom and chaos has ensued. The children came in on Monday to find a mysterious treasure chest in the middle of the carpet. Each day something new has appeared in the box and so far we have found treasure, pirates, clues and a book! Our new learning journey is 'The Night Pirates' by Peter Harris, a story about a mysterious ship that steals a little boy's house and - the best bit - all the pirates are girls! As this will be our least learning journey of the year, there will be multiple outcomes such as poems, letters, reports, narratives and factfiles.

In Maths last week, the children explored capacity and volume. They began by exploring different sizes of jug and pouring coloured liquid between them. They then wrote their own recipes using mathematical language such as full, empty and half full. Beech used their recipes the next day to create potions in a giant cauldron and named their concoctions. This week they have been focusing on grouping and sharing, using concrete resources to build their understanding of multiplication and division.

In the afternoons, we have been sharing what food is special to us and linking this to foods that are used to celebrate events in the Christian and Jewish calendar. We have also started our PSHE topic on growing and changing by discussing and creating life cycles of a butterfly and a frog.



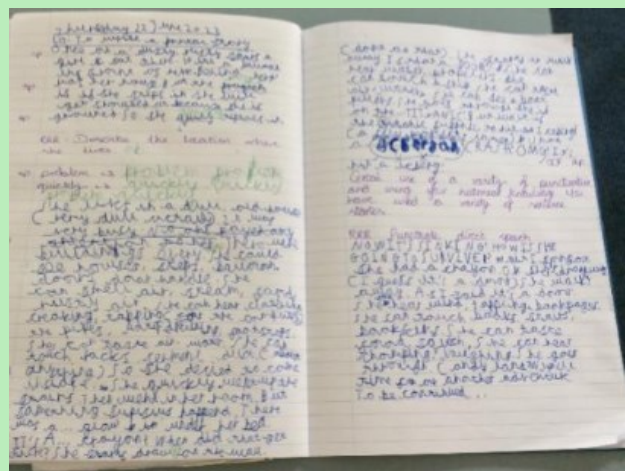
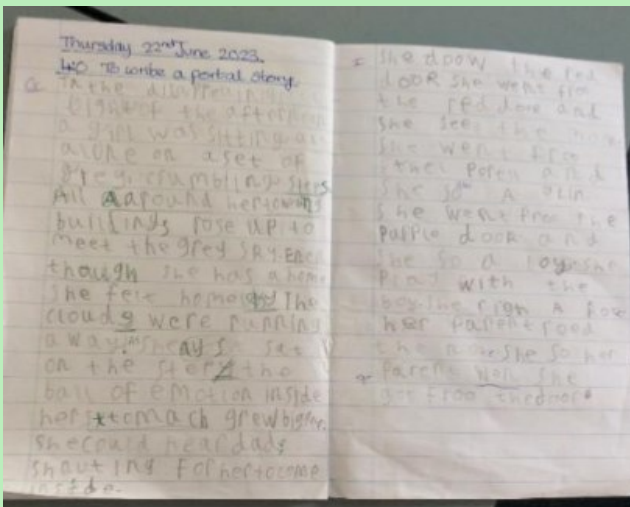
Willow Class

We have come to the end of our current unit of work in English. Last week, the children explored different features to use within their portal stories (progressive tense, adverbs, prepositions) and have been writing their stories this week. We have taken the writing slowly, focusing on a different part each day. Within their writing, the children have been able to describe their location in detail, creating an image of it within the reader's mind.

Last week in Maths, the children looked at multiplication, as well as division for the year 2s. Year 2 secured their understanding of how arrays could be used to show multiplication and division, whilst Year 3 looked at using the grid method as a formal way to solve more complex multiplication calculations. The year 3s also looked at scaling and when this would be used. Within groups, they were given a recipe and were tasked with scaling it up to make a different number of food items.

We have continued to look at sewing stitches within design and technology on Fridays. The children have focused on back stitch and becoming secure on it. We have also begun to look at different ways to secure the edges through blanket stitch.

In Geography, the children have created maps to support us in getting from school to the park. They have had to include a key into their work and have thought about what they would see along the way. They will use these maps next week to get to the park, adding anything they missed on route.



Oak Class

School play practice has been in full swing in Oak class, with the children all working incredibly hard to learn their lines. We have had the help of Mrs Bowyer, who has been helping make fantastic props with the children and we have had lots of compliments on the beautiful singing that can be heard down the corridors. Please remember to book your tickets for Monday 10th July (afternoon performance) or Tuesday 11th July (6:00pm)!

Our curriculum lessons have not stopped and we have been using all the time in the school day to continue to further our learning. In Maths, we have been focussing on time and using our recall of different time facts to help solve problems. We also have been exploring a variety of time duration problems, using time lines to help work out end times and elapsed times. We finished our learning journey in English, writing a chapter from 'The Queen's Tale' in the perspective of the Huntsman. The children really enjoyed using their imagination to adapt the story to make it their own.

In Science, we have continued learning about the circulatory system. In last week's lesson, we learnt about the key parts of the circulatory system and identified different parts of the heart and lungs. This week, we used this understanding to explain how blood is oxygenated and transported round the body. We went out to the playground and became red blood cells ourselves to bring the circulatory system to life! In our PSHE lessons, we have been learning about the changes our bodies can go through. The children have been mature during these lessons and we have been able to take part in some useful and meaningful discussions. We have also been enjoying our weekly swimming lessons at Farleigh. Every week, we work on different skills in our groups, improving our strokes and practising skills such as seated dives and treading water. Miss Lee has already seen some great progress in our swimming! Thank you again to all the parents who offer transport every week - these opportunities would not be possible without you.



Year 6 Leavers Service

Our Year 6 children were fortunate enough to be invited to Winchester Cathedral to attend the Year 6 Leavers Service on Friday 16th June. This event is attended by over 2,000 children over the week, all of whom attend a Church of England school in Hampshire. The morning was filled with a range of workshops, including calligraphy and our own opportunity to explore the cathedral. In the afternoon, we attended the Leavers Service, where a variety of songs were sung and we took part in a drumming masterclass. Marley and Abigail did a fantastic job carrying our school banner in the procession and Chloe went with Miss Lee to collect the candle and say the Lord's Prayer at the end of the service.
