Our unit on 'computational thinking' will develop key skills such as abstraction and decomposition and explore how we use these in everyday life and when coding.

Art/ DT

Children will explore how compressed air can be used to create movement when making pneumatic toys.

MFL – French

Mrs Bottle will be teaching children using the stimulus 'Les Quatre Amis' to learn vocabulary based on animals.

RE

Throughout this unit, children will recall key events during Holy Week, exploring the concept of 'Salvation' and try to answer the question 'Why do Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday'?

What your children will be learning this term

English

Our writing journey will focus on the text '*Baker By the Sea*' by Paula White. We will use this as a stimulus to write letters of advice and create a tourist brochure for the fishing village in the story.

Science

In this topic, children will learn how living things can be grouped and classified. They will explore different habitats, identify plants and animals, use simple classification keys, and understand how characteristics help scientists organise and describe the wide variety of living things on Earth.

Maths

This term focusses on developing mental strategies and formal methods to multiply and divide. We will explore different ways to measure time and learn how to read an analogue clock.

History

Our focus in History this term will be the settlement of the Anglo-Saxons and Scots in Britain. We will identify where the Anglo Saxons came from and evaluate reasons why they invaded Britain. We will then use sources to identify how they lived and the impact they had on Britain.

Music

Our 'body and tuned percussion' unit encourages pupils to use their bodies as well as instruments like glockenspiels and xylophones to represent rainforest environments.

PE

Children will develop their ball chasing and stance with Miss Lee. Harry will use Real Gym to focus on selecting and linking movements together to fit a theme.

PSHE (Scarf)

Children will continue to learn about 'Rights and Respect', exploring how to stay safe and healthy and how we can make a difference in our local community.
