

Computing

In Computing, children will understand how search systems work and develop searching skills to find relevant and accurate information online.

French

In French, children will explore common words and phrases associated with 'School Life'.

RE

In Religious Education, the focus will be on Humanism. Children will learn about what humanists believe makes a 'good life', including ideas about values, choices, and responsibility. They will also have opportunities to reflect on their own beliefs and consider how these ideas might connect to their everyday lives.

What your children will be learning this term

Maths

In Mathematics, children will use addition, subtraction, multiplication and division to explore factors and multiples in more depth. They will draw and interpret graphs, learn how to work with quadrants, and solve problems involving missing numbers. They will also be introduced to the basics of algebra, helping them understand how numbers and symbols can represent relationships.

Science

In Science, children will learn about common electrical appliances and how they work. They will build a simple circuit and identify the different parts, such as cells, wires, bulbs, switches and buzzers. They will also learn what each part does and how electricity flows through a circuit to make it work.

English

In English, children will finish their work on *Lizzie and Belle* by writing letters and biographies based on what they have learned. This will help them practise formal writing, organise their ideas clearly, and use appropriate language for different purposes. After that, they will study *The Errand*, where they will focus on how to structure their writing and develop interesting stories with clear beginnings, middles and endings.

History

In History, children will study World War Two, focusing on how the war affected the lives of women, men and children. They will learn about important changes during this time and explore the experiences of evacuees, including the challenges they faced and how they adapted to new environments.

Music

In Music, children will use a variety of instruments to explore different themes or music and experiment with multiple rhythms.

Art/DT

In Art, children will focus on everyday drawing using ink. They will practise observing objects carefully and recording what they see, while experimenting with different techniques.

PE

In PE, children will have their swimming block. Additionally, children will develop and apply their seated balance and floor work balance through focused skill development sessions.

PSHE (Scarf)

In PSHE, children will reflect on friendships and social dynamics, leading a healthy lifestyle and risk management.
